GUILDHALL ARROW

The Guildhall Arrow shoot took place on Sunday 29th July. This from our lady on the scene, Jan Damsell:

On a glorious English Summer afternoon in July the above-mentioned competition took place with 12 good and true longbow archers.

A western round commenced at 1pm for the honour of winning the trophy. The trophy was made by Frank Damsell and is a full size wooden arrow, standing on a base. Both are made of oak dated circa 1395 AD, which was taken from a beam in Leicester Guildhall during renovations. The oak pre-dates the Battle of Agincourt!

Frank Damsell led most of the way, closely followed by Barry Johnson and Rosie Clarkson. Then it came down to the last ½ dozen arrows with Frank 2 points ahead of Rosie. With all left to shoot for, Rosie mercilessly stormed away and got 3x 9's, 2x 7's and a 5. Although Frank had a 6-scoring end he got considerably less!

So there you have it. Final scores were Rosie 326, Frank 301 and Barry 300.

Last year's winner (some lesser archer called Kevin Clarkson) has graciously consented to polish his wife's trophy for the next year!
