FIELD SHOOTS

CLOUT

Just a reminder that the clout shoot takes place at the shooting ground on the 1st January, starting at midday. Using the clubs training bows, it's a challenge to try and drop arrows as close to a pole in the ground as possible. Just bring your arrows, arm guards, and probably your gloves.

BAREBOW COMPETITION

There was a Barebow Competition held on the 23rd September, Bob Jennings writes:

This was the second competition for the Barebow Cup, formerly held by Andy. There were six novelty faces to shoot at, at distances varying between a tantalising eight yards and a more ordinary thirty-five. Each of the pictures scored five for a 'hit' and ten for a 'kill' and the closer ones were smaller. The maximum score possible was 360.

Kevin Clarkson won with 195 (54%) with ten kills - congratulations Kevin on a real achievement. (Kevin was the only one to hit the label on the picture of a beer bottle). Bob 2nd with 140 (39%) with six kills, then Kevan with 110 (30%) with five kills. Dave got 105 (29%) & four kills, and Rose got 75 (21%) & two kills.

All were good results for what was an extremely taxing set up. Thanks go to the competitors for attending, and for putting up and taking down their own bosses, but the organiser remains disappointed that only the 'stalwarts' attended. It would have been even more fun if we could have attracted some newcomers to this particular activity.
