The 3 members from Bowmen of Glen, stuck it to the end and were among the 6 archers to finish the competition, which I feel was an achievement in itself.

Mohit came first in 'Gents York Recurve' with a Score of 673.

I came first in 'Gents Bristol II Recurve' with a score of 664.

James came first in 'Junior Gents Recurve' with a score of 610, which will also clinch his U12 Frist Class Badge. Still in his first year of archery, James seems to have taken to it like a duck to water!
